Character Study: Jacob Part 4 – Jacob Learns about Loyalty Genesis 34-49

What's happening?

- Jacob continued his journey back to Canaan. Along the way he made a stop in Shechem, where his <u>daughter</u> was greatly mistreated. Two of his sons responded by <u>killing</u> the men there and <u>plundering</u> their city. Jacob feared the surrounding cities would retaliate. (34:1-31)
- God told Jacob to go to <u>Bethel</u> (located in Canaan). In preparation, Jacob told his family to put away the foreign gods that were among them, purify themselves, and change their clothes. This act of <u>purification</u> showed their desire for complete loyalty to God. (35:1-4)
- Arriving in Bethel, God told Jacob to <u>multiply</u>, reminding him that a nation would come from him, as well as future kings. (35:5-15)
- Shortly later, during the birth of Jacob's twelfth son (Benjamin), <u>Rachel</u> died. Jacob journeyed to see his father and was able to reunite with him before his father passed away as well. (35:16-29)
- Later in life, Jacob would travel with his family down to <u>Egypt</u> (see "Joseph" study). The Israelites would not return to live in their land again until Joshua led them back in hundreds of years later. Jacob blessed each of his sons before his death at the age of <u>147</u>. (46:1-49:33)

What's God doing?

- > The stop in Shechem was unnecessary and only prolonged Jacob from reaching his final destination. God used this as a means to both <u>convict</u> Jacob of the dangers of idolatry and <u>teach</u> him about loyalty.
- > The blessing Jacob gave Judah (49:8-12) is interestingly prophetic in that it recognized Judah's <u>superiority</u> over his brothers, even stating that through him one would come that would receive "the obedience of the people." This prophecy points to the royal <u>kingship</u> that would come through Judah (fulfilled in David, and ultimately in Christ Matt. 1:1-16; Rev. 5:5).

What's to learn?

→ Jacob got sidetracked on his journey, resulting in a horrible situation in Shechem. He failed to grasp the importance of holiness and loyalty to God. Are you sidetracked in your obedience to God? Jacob found the key to obedience is staying focused on the goal! We must do the same!

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
