Character Study: Joseph Part 1 – Joseph Faces Trouble Genesis 37

What's happening?

• Joseph was the son of Jacob. Jacob loved Joseph more than any of his other children and gave him a <u>coat of many colors</u>. (37:1-3)

• Joseph's brothers grew very jealous of him. Joseph told his brothers about some <u>dreams</u> he had that implied they would one day bow down to him. This fueled their jealousy and they sought to <u>kill</u> him. (37:4-18)

• Reuben (one of the brothers) spared his life by convincing his brothers not to kill him. Instead, they threw Joseph into a <u>pit</u> and shortly later sold him to some merchants for <u>twenty</u> shekels of silver. (37:19-28)

• Joseph's brothers kept the coat of many colors and took it back to their father. They made it appear that Joseph had been attacked and killed by a <u>wild beast</u>. Jacob mourned for many days. (37:29-35)

• Joseph was taken to Egypt where he was sold to <u>Potiphar</u>, an officer of Pharaoh. (37:36)

What's God doing?

> Though not revealing exactly how or when it would happen, God did reveal His plan to have Joseph <u>rule</u> over his family one day.

> Knowing the <u>hearts</u> and <u>intentions</u> of the brothers, God continued to sovereignly carry out His plan for Joseph's life.

What's to learn?

 \rightarrow <u>Jealousy</u> and <u>bitterness</u> lead to <u>hate</u>. Hatred will give us evil thoughts which lead to evil actions. Is there any jealousy, bitterness or hatred in your heart of which you need to repent? (Note James 3:14-16)

 \rightarrow Because God is sovereign, we can trust Him when things seem hopeless. Despite the <u>situations</u> we find ourselves in and the <u>actions</u> of others, God is in control and actively working out His plan.

 \rightarrow God often takes us through <u>difficult</u> times in order to accomplish a <u>great</u> purpose. Can you think of examples from your life that show this is true?
