Character Study: Abraham Part 1 – The Call Genesis 12:1-9

What's happening?

• Abraham (seen in these early chapters as "Abram") was from <u>Ur</u> of the <u>Chaldeans</u>. After his brother died, Abraham, along with his father (Terah), wife (Sarah), and nephew (Lot), moved to Haran. (note 11:27-32)

• God had communicated with Abraham, telling him "Get out of your <u>country</u>, from your <u>family</u> and from your father's <u>house</u>, to a <u>land</u> I will show you." (12:1)

• God made a covenant with Abraham in which He promised to make him a great <u>nation</u>, <u>bless</u> him and make his <u>name</u> great. He also promised that people would be blessed or cursed based on how they <u>treated</u> him, and that in him all the nations of the earth would be <u>blessed</u>. (12:2-3)

• Abraham, being <u>obedient</u> to God, journeyed to the land of <u>Canaan</u> with Sarah, Lot, and some people they meet in Haran. Once there, God promised that one day that land would belong to his descendants. Abraham responded by building an <u>altar</u> to the Lord. (12:4-9)

What's God doing?

> Abraham was from a family of idolaters. His father worshiped other gods (Josh. 24:2). Yet God chose this man by whom He would start a new <u>nation</u>, a nation through which blessing would come to the world.

> As descendants of Abraham, Israelites recognize that their nation was founded on God's <u>promises</u>. Experiencing divine blessing and protection were promises of God, though each generation would need <u>faith</u> in order to experience these things.

What's to learn?

 \rightarrow Abraham was told to "go," but he knew nothing about the land to which he was to go. Abraham followed God out of <u>faith</u>, setting an <u>example</u> for us all (note Heb. 11:8-10).

 \rightarrow Even though the Canaanites were currently living in the land God had promised to Abraham, Abraham still built an altar there to <u>worship</u> and <u>exalt</u> God. He had <u>confidence</u> that God would carry out His promises. Do you have the same confidence in God?
