Character Study: Isaac Part 3 – Isaac Blesses Jacob Genesis 26-35

What's happening?

• God confirmed the covenant with Isaac and allowed him to grow in <u>prosperity</u>. This was despite an incident during a famine where he lied to a Philistine king (Abimelech) about his wife in hopes of not being killed. Discovering the lie, the king was upset, but gracious. (26:1-14)

• As Isaac grew old in age, he suffered from bad vision and could no longer see. He made preparations to <u>bless</u> Esau before he died. However, while Esau was out hunting, Rebekah encouraged Jacob to go to Isaac (pretending to be Esau) and receive the <u>blessing</u> instead. (27:1-17)

• Rebekah had Jacob put on Esau's <u>clothes</u> and use animal <u>skins</u> to imitate Esau's hairy body. Jacob, saying he was Esau, took a meal to Isaac that Isaac had asked Esau to prepare. Isaac thought the <u>voice</u> sounded like Jacob's, but from the hairy skins and smell of the clothes, he became convinced he was Esau and blessed him. (27:18-26)

• Isaac offered Jacob a blessing which included <u>wealth</u>, <u>respect</u> from other nations, and <u>authority</u> over his brothers. When Esau returned and heard his blessing had gone to Jacob, he became angry and desired to <u>kill</u> his brother. Rebecca told Jacob that he should leave home for his safety. Isaac sent Jacob off, reminding him that the blessings of Abraham were his and his descendants. (27:27-28:5)

• At <u>180</u> years of age, Isaac died. He was buried by his sons. (35:27-29)

What's God doing?

> God had carried out His promises through Isaac, and He would now carry them on through Isaac's son Jacob. Why did God choose Jacob instead of Esau? Romans 9:10-13 tells us that it was simply <u>God's plan</u>. Hebrews 12:16-17 confirms that God's plan was truly the best.

What's to learn?

→ Isaac and Esau knew Jacob was to receive the firstborn's blessing (Isaac knew God had determined this – Gen. 25:23; and Esau knew Jacob had the birthright), yet they <u>fought</u> against it. Rebekah and Jacob knew as well, yet they used <u>deception</u> to try to secure the blessing. Failing to trust God only brought hatred and strife to their family. How has doing things <u>your way</u> brought you heartache? In what areas of life do you need to trust God and follow <u>God's way</u> more?
