## Character Study: Joseph Part 4 – Joseph Experiences Success Genesis 41

#### What's happening?

- While Joseph remained in prison, Pharaoh had two <u>dreams</u> that greatly troubled him. He sought for someone who could interpret these dreams, but was unable to find anyone who could help. (41:1-8)
- Hearing about this, the <u>butler</u> remembered Joseph and told the Pharaoh about his ability to interpret dreams. (41:9-13)
- Pharaoh shared his dreams with Joseph. Joseph explained that the dreams were from God, showing that He was going to give Egypt seven years of <u>plenty</u>, followed by seven years of <u>famine</u>. (41:14-32)
- Joseph encouraged Pharaoh to save <u>food</u> in preparation for the famine. Pharaoh saw Joseph's discernment and <u>wisdom</u> and placed him over all the people. (41:33-45)
- Joseph prepared Egypt for the coming famine. When the famine arrived, people travelled from far away to get <u>food</u> from Joseph. (41:46-57)

### What's God doing?

- > During this time period, God gave Joseph a wife (Asenath), followed by two sons (Manasseh and Ephraim). (41:45, 50-52)
- > God had elevated Joseph to the second highest-ranking position in Egypt. Through God's perfect <u>plan</u> and perfect <u>timing</u>, Joseph was in the perfect scenario to be given a prominent position of influence.

#### What's to learn?

- → It would not be easy for Joseph (a Hebrew) to rule in Egypt, especially while dealing with a famine. Yet, through the <u>experiences</u> of Joseph's life, God had taught him the <u>humility</u> and <u>faith</u> needed to succeed (note v. 16). What lessons has God taught you in life that have prepared you for success? What is He teaching you now?
- → Joseph received his leadership position because he was a person in whom was "the Spirit of God" (v. 38). Leadership qualities are not merely physical, or based on talent and skill. Becoming a leader is based on one's character, resulting from a meaningful walk with God!
