Character Study: Moses Part 1 – The Birth of a Leader Exodus 1:1-2:10

What's happening?

• Moses was born at a time when the Israelites lived in <u>Egypt</u>. The Pharaoh saw the growing number of Israelites as a threat, so he forced them into <u>slave labor</u>, and even gave the order to have each baby boy born to a Hebrew woman thrown into the <u>river</u>. (1:1-22)

• During this time period, Moses was born. His parents, named Amram and Jochebed (*Ex. 6:20*), were of the house of Levi. His mother kept him hidden for <u>three</u> months, but once she could not keep him hidden any longer, she placed him in a <u>basket</u> and set it in the river. His sister watched from a distance to see what would happen. (2:1-4)

• Moses was discovered along the river bank by Pharaoh's <u>daughter</u>. She recognized him has a Hebrew, but had compassion on him. Moses' sister spoke to her and suggested having a Hebrew woman care for the baby. The Pharaoh's daughter agreed, so Moses' sister went and got her <u>mother</u>, who took Moses to nurse him. (2:5-9)

• As the child grew, the Pharaoh's daughter took Moses in and raised him as her son. She gave him the name "Moses" (meaning "<u>drawn out</u>") since she drew him out of the water. (2:10)

What's God doing?

> Though Moses was a Hebrew, he was educated in the <u>wisdom</u> of the Egyptians and brought up in the <u>royalty</u> of the Pharaoh's palace. God had not only delivered Moses from death, but He also placed him exactly where He wanted him to be. God was <u>preparing</u> Moses for how He would use him in the years ahead. (Note Acts 7:22)

What's to learn?

→ There are no <u>accidents</u> or <u>coincidences</u> with God. In God's sovereignty, He placed Moses where He wanted him to be. Do you realize the people in your life are there by God's sovereign design? Through the good experiences or the bad(!), you are where God wants you to be (Note Ps. 139:15-16)!

 \rightarrow It is sometimes easy to take those around us for granted, but when we realize God has placed them in our lives to accomplish His <u>purposes</u>, we will have the right perspective. Can you think of ways God is using the people in your life to teach you things and/or prepare you for the future?
