Christian Doctrine Angels (Part 1) The Creation of Angels and Their Attributes

The Creation of Angels

Angels are a part of God's <u>creation</u> (Ps. 148:5; Col. 1:16). The exact time of their creation is not stated in Scripture, but as with all creation, it would have been before the end of the creation week. The Bible does not state exactly how many angels were created, but it does reveal that the number is extremely large (Dan. 7:10; Heb. 12:22; Rev. 5:11 – the descriptions imply a number that cannot be counted). Angels were created to <u>praise</u> God and to <u>serve</u> Him in carrying out His will (Ps. 148:1-3; Heb. 1:7).

The Original State of Angels

Along with all of God's creation, angels were considered "<u>very good</u>" (Gen. 1:31). Just like mankind, all angels were originally without <u>sin</u> and <u>holy</u>. Even after Satan rebelled, the angels who did not rebel with him remained in a state of <u>holiness</u> ("holy angels" - <u>Mark 8:38</u>).

What Are Angels Like?

- They have <u>personality</u> (intellect, emotion, and will I Pet. 1:12; Luke 15:10; II Tim. 2:26).
- They are <u>spirit</u> beings who can (on occasion) take on human form (Gen. 18; John 20:12; Heb. 13:2).
- They do not <u>marry</u>, have <u>children</u> or <u>die</u> (Luke 20:34-36).
- They do not have <u>gender</u> (are not male nor female), though in the Bible they are always referred to in male terms (Matt. 28:2-7; Mark 16:5-6; Luke 24:4; Acts 1:10).
- They are exceptionally <u>knowledgeable</u>, though not omniscient like God (II Sam. 14:20; Matt. 24:36).
- They are <u>stronger</u> and more <u>powerful</u> than humans (II Pet. 2:11; Ps. 103:20). This was seen when they freed the apostles from <u>prison</u> (Acts 5:19) and rolled the <u>stone</u> away from Jesus' tomb (Matt. 28:2).

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
