New Testament Breakdown

<p><u>The Gospels</u> Matthew Mark Luke John</p>	<p>The birth of Jesus and His life on earth. Presents Him as King, Servant, the Son of Man and the Son of God. Records His teachings and tells of His miracles. Concludes with His crucifixion and resurrection.</p>
<p><u>History</u> Acts</p>	<p>The beginning of the church and its growth.</p>
<p><u>Paul's Letters</u> Romans I & II Corinthians Galatians Ephesians Philippians Colossians I & II Thessalonians I & II Timothy Titus Philemon</p>	<p>Explains salvation through Jesus Christ, new life in Christ, and how believers should live in light of their salvation. Discusses topics such as the purpose of the church, the role of individuals within a family, and the importance of being filled with the Holy Spirit. Also expresses the need for sound doctrine in light of the many false teachers in the world.</p>
<p><u>General Letters</u> Hebrews James I & II Peter I, II & III John Jude</p>	<p>Teachings which include the superiority of Christ, the importance of good works, handling trials and suffering, and warnings against false teachers.</p>
<p><u>Prophecy</u> Revelation</p>	<p>Future events laid out, including: the work of the antichrist, God's judgment on the world, Christ's Second Coming, the Battle of Armageddon, the Millennial Reign of Christ, and the new heaven and new earth.</p>
