God Is Love

What Does This Mean?

- God gives of <u>Himself</u> for the <u>benefit</u> and ultimate good of others.
- God's love is at the <u>center</u> of His other attributes.
 Out of God's love comes His kindness, grace, etc.

Where Do We See This in Scripture?

- "God is <u>love</u>" (I John 4:16) and He is described as "the God of love" (II Cor. 13:11).
- "Anyone who does not <u>love</u> does not <u>know</u> God, because God is love" (I John 4:8).
- "For God so <u>loved</u> the world, that he <u>gave</u> his only Son..." (John 3:16).
- "God shows His <u>love</u> for <u>us</u> in that while we were still sinners, Christ died for us" (Rom. 5:8; note I John 4:9-10).
- God's love for us will never end because His love is based on His unchanging <u>nature</u>. This endless love was shown to Israel in the Old Testament (Jer. 31:3), just as it is shown to <u>us</u> today (Eph. 5:25).

What Does This Mean for Me?

- ⇒ Understanding God's love for us should ignite a desire in us to show love in return. "We love because He first loved us" (I John 4:19; note I John 5:3).
- ⇒ Genuine love for God will be shown through a sacrificial <u>love</u> for others (John 13:35; I John 4:21).
- ⇒ Just as God loved us, our love for others must be based on an intentional <u>choice</u> to do so (not an emotional response), even in moments when it may seem difficult (I Cor. 13).
- ⇒ An understanding of God's love for us will relieve us of any <u>fears</u> we may struggle with (I John 4:18).
