God Is Spirit

What Does This Mean?

- God's nature is spiritual. He is a spiritual being.
- He is not composed of physical material (for example, a body, like we have).

Where Do We See This in Scripture?

- "God is spirit" (John 4:24). "A spirit does not have flesh and bones..." (Luke 24:39).
- This explains why He is invisible (Col. 1:15; I Tim. 1:17; Heb. 11:27).
- Jesus said that no one has seen God (John 1:18; 5:37; 6:46).
 - * God did reveal Himself to man in a few instances, and man was able to recognize His presence, but no one ever saw Him in His entirety (in all His glory). Note Exodus 33:20: "You cannot see my face; for man shall not see me and live."

"Anthropomorphism" - Using human features to describe God and His actions in order to help us relate to Him. God is described as having eyes (II Chron. 16:9), feet (Gen 3:8), hands (Is. 65:2; Heb. 1:10), ears (Neh. 1:6; Ps. 34:15), etc. These are all analogies, not actual body parts.

> What Does This Mean for Me?

- ⇒ We can now better understand the second of the Ten Commandments: not to make graven images/idols. No one knows what God looks like, so no image could accurately represent Him. God is above and beyond any handmade physical object. (Ex. 20:4; note Deut. 4:15-19)
- ⇒ As John 4:24 states, we must worship God "in spirit and truth." Since God is spirit we must worship Him in spirit. This means our worship should not be limited to certain places or formalities.

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
