God Is Omnipotent

What Does This Mean?

• God is all-powerful. God is able to do anything that is in accord with His <u>will</u> and <u>nature</u>.

> Where Do We See This in Scripture?

- Nothing is "<u>impossible</u> with God" (Luke 1:37).
- "With God all things are <u>possible</u>" (Matt. 19:26).
- God describes Himself as "the <u>Almighty</u> One" (Gen. 17:1; Is. 1:24; II Cor. 6:18; Rev. 1:8; 19:6).
- "Ah, Lord God! It is you who have made the <u>heavens</u> and the <u>earth</u> by your great power and by your outstretched arm. Nothing is too hard for you" (Jer. 32:17).
- The <u>gospel</u> is the "power of God" for salvation (Rom. 1:16), which includes the power of God seen in Christ's resurrection from the dead (II Cor. 13:4).
- God's power can also be seen as He unfolds His plan for our <u>lives</u> (Eph. 1:11; Rom. 8:29-30).

What Does This Mean for Me?

- ⇒ In the face of difficulties, we must remember that we have <u>Christ's</u> strength which enables us to "do all things" (Phil. 4:13).
- ⇒ No prayer <u>request</u> is too big for God (Phil. 4:6). Yet we must learn to pray in such a way that desires <u>His</u> <u>will</u> (not ours!) to be accomplished. Great <u>comfort</u> comes from knowing our requests are in the hands of an Almighty God. Great <u>peace</u> comes from knowing He will accomplish His will.
- ⇒ As we look at the world around us, and as we examine our own lives, we need to have a heart of <u>praise</u> and <u>thanksgiving</u> at how God has displayed His power in so many awesome ways!
