Christian Doctrine The Holy Spirit (Part 3) The Holy Spirit's Role in Salvation

The Work of the Holy Spirit in Salvation

The Holy Spirit plays a significant part in the work of salvation. Scripture reveals works done by the Holy Spirit that lead a person to salvation, as well as works He accomplishes the moment a person gets saved.

Key Works Leading to Salvation

- ➤ He <u>convicts</u>. This is the Holy Spirit's work of convincing a person of their need for Christ. <u>John 16:8-11</u> points out that the Holy Spirit convicts of three things: <u>sin</u> (the fact a person is guilty before God), <u>righteousness</u> (the fact that righteousness is provided through Christ) and <u>judgment</u> (the fact condemnation awaits those who reject Christ).
- ➤ He <u>calls</u>. Scripture gives a general "call", or invitation, for all people to accept the gospel (John 7:37), but Scripture also describes what is often referred to as an "effective calling" to people whom God is drawing to Himself for salvation. This is a work in which the Holy Spirit "<u>opens the eyes</u>" of people to the truth and <u>points</u> them to Christ (Rom. 8:30; Acts 16:14; II Thess. 2:13-14).

Key Works at the Moment of Salvation

- ➤ He <u>regenerates</u>. The Holy Spirit gives new, spiritual life to those who believe (John 1:3; 3:5; Titus 3:5).
- ➤ He <u>indwells</u>. This refers to the Holy Spirit's presence which indwells each believer at the moment they are saved. This is described as a <u>gift</u> which Christ had promised to give after His ascension (John 7:37-39; 14:17; Acts 2:38).
 - This is true of <u>all</u> believers (Rom. 5:5; 8:9; II Cor. 5:5).
 - This is a <u>permanent</u> indwelling (John 14:16).
- ➤ He <u>baptizes</u>. This is the act of joining a believer to the Body of Christ and identifying them with Christ's death, burial and resurrection (I Cor. 12:13; Rom. 6:3-4; Eph. 4:5).
 - This is a <u>one-time</u> act (I Cor. 12:13).
 - This is a work that God accomplishes at <u>salvation</u>, not something believers need to seek.
- ➤ He <u>seals</u>. The Holy Spirit is our guarantee that all God has promised us will be fulfilled (II Cor. 1:22; Eph. 1:13; 4:30).
