Christian Doctrine Mankind (Part 4) Why Were We Created?

Everyone Wants Purpose in Life

The meaning behind our existence is, possibly, the biggest question we have. Everyone desires to know why they are here on Earth. There are many things people do in order to have a sense of <u>purpose</u> and <u>meaning</u> in their lives:

- > Donate <u>money</u> to charities
- Help people who are in <u>need</u>
- Work hard to have a successful <u>career</u>

Though these may all be good things to do, Scripture says that there is an even greater purpose behind our existence.

The Purpose of Our Existence

Scripture states that our entire existence is for one main purpose: that throughout our lives, we may <u>give</u> God <u>glory</u> (Is. 43:7; Eph. 1:11-12). Many times we selfishly think that the world revolves around us. But the fact is that God is the Creator of all things and all things were created for His purposes (Rom. 11:36). God alone is <u>worthy</u> of receiving such glory (Rev. 4:11). Therefore, our lives are to give our Creator recognition and glory for who He is. Since our Heavenly Father is loving, giving, all-powerful, sovereign (etc.), giving Him glory should come easily for us (I Cor. 10:31).

How to Accomplish Our Purpose

God is glorified when we <u>love</u> Him (Matt. 22:37), <u>praise</u> Him (Ps. 50:23), <u>trust</u> Him (Rom. 4:20) and <u>obey</u> Him (Matt. 5:16). In a world that exalts movie stars and athletes, we should be known as people who uplift and magnify the Almighty God. When our lives are lived to give glory to God, therein we find real purpose. When this happens, God Himself <u>rejoices</u> and we are able to experience the joy and <u>satisfaction</u> that can only come by fulfilling the purpose for which we were created (Is. 62:5; I Pet. 1:8).
