I Peter 1:13-21

Hope Leads to Holiness

- > What three things are we told to do in verse 13 that will prepare us to live a life for God? Prepare your mind for action, be self-controlled, and set your hope fully on Christ.
- > A changed life will reflect which characteristic of God (vv. 14-16)? <u>Holiness</u>. How will this impact the way we relate to our culture? <u>When we imitate God's holiness, the difference between us and the way of the world becomes apparent. We will abandon worldly desires in pursuit of godly desires.</u>
- > What response to God is described in verse 17? Fear In what way will this impact the way we relate to God? A recognition of who God is and the fact that we are answerable to Him will directly influence our desire to live a life that honors Him.
- > Why do you think Peter links the response to God (from v. 17) to salvation (vv. 18-21)? How do they relate? The seriousness of sin is high and so was its payment (Christ's life). Our lives should show an understanding of that as we live to honor God.

Application

Consider how you would honestly answer these questions:

- When you think about God, what is it about Him that gives you a desire to live a life that pleases Him?
- What things in your life do not reflect God's holiness? How can godly hope and fear push you toward holiness?

When we are focused on Christ, we will be characterized by both the hope that He gives and the holiness that He desires of us! Take time each day to consider the greatness of God's promises and character. Remember, when we see God for who He is, the impact on our lives will affect how the world sees us! May our lives reflect the glory of Christ!
