The Power of the Word in Spiritual Growth

- > As a result of being born again, what key command is given in [1:22](#)? Love one another fervently with a pure heart.
- > What similarity is seen between how our salvation is described and how God's Word is described ([v. 23-25](#))? They are eternal (salvation - incorruptible, the Word - abides forever).
- > What sins are we told to put off in [2:1](#)? Malice (ill-will toward someone), deceit, hypocrisy, envy, evil speaking/slander.
- > What is the key to spiritual growth according to [2:2](#)? God's Word – getting into it, reading it, and letting it change us.

Application

Answer the follow questions concerning spiritual growth:

- An evidence for spiritual maturity is seen in how we relate to people around us (see [2:1](#)). How does the way we treat people act as a gauge of our maturity? Maturity is seen in putting God and others first. Putting aside pride, selfishness, hypocrisy (etc.) demonstrates God's work in us.
- Our salvation is based on the Word of God, and so is our spiritual growth. What does [Ps. 119:11](#) teach concerning the role of God's Word in our lives? Making God's Word an active part of our life gives strength to be victorious over sin.
- List different ways you can make God's Word a more meaningful part of your life? Reading it! Also memorizing key passages, in-depth study, journaling thoughts, etc.

What areas of your life display spiritual immaturity? What steps do you need to take to become more Christ-like? When we are serious about growing in our walk with God, we will thirst for God's Word and put into practice what God tells us to do! When we do this, spiritual growth will occur!
